We implemented Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) in our Residential Program.

We opened our stand alone Revive Recovery Home at the Level 2 certification per the National Alliance for Recovery Residences (NARR).

We renovated the work-out space in the Adam Lowe Center thanks to a grant from the KY Colonels.

We launched evening hours for our Outpatient Center clients.

We received \$180,803.00 in grants, in addition to a generous donation for the purchase of our Revive Recovery House.

CELEBRATING A
LIFE AWAKENED

I started drinking around 13 and at 28 started using harder and harder stuff. I didn't have more than a year sober since 15...until March 26th, 2020 at 44 years old.

I had been carrying the guilt and shame of not wanting to let others down. I lost two good friends – one on my couch – and fell deeper into rough times. After seeing Revive's information, I talked to someone and got in right before COVID shut downs. It was different from a lot of other experiences, but one day it clicked. I journaled and took notes and learned to open up and the sense of community was the puzzle piece I was missing. **Revive** was that puzzle piece. I watched people imitate Christ and saw the fruit in their lives and it drew me in. The amazing clinical team helped me talk through and process grief and my emotions. Peer Support gave me opportunities to express myself and trust the community around me. I can now feel emotions, process emotions, and show emotions. I was more than just a number; people cared and wanted to know me. **It was beautifully done.**

Community and love are fostered so well at Revive, and it starts to take root and weaves into your life. People pick up on it – on the brotherhood. It's still like that and keeps going. Working at Revive, God has placed a hope in me to share with others. I see people falling for the same old lie that drugs and alcohol will make it all better and how it affects families and want to give people the hope that I have. I want better for people.

Thanks to mentors and friends like Darrell, Tom, Seth, Mason, Cruz and so many more, I now get to work on being a dad, restoring relationships. There are moments I can't get back with my older children, but I was there for my youngest son's first day of school. I recently spent a weekend in Cumberland Falls with my wife Shalah, who is a constant source of support. Life is fun.

I still have trials but see the blessing and joy because it's producing something. This March will mark 3 years sober, and I'm grateful to Revive and those who walked with me to be here today.

Life House

1) Introduce a new exercise program so that our clients understand the importance of physical health while learning about the **importance of routine and discipline in their overall recovery journey.**

2) Continue to ensure timely follow-up with medical appointments and help clients learn that their **physical and mental well being are both important for a holistic approach to recovery.**

Common Ground

We are expanding services beyond recovery with the Common Ground Resource Center, formally the Nicholasville Christian Church. CGRC focuses on awakening a life of community for those around us eager to serve and grow through CGRC, and we are already partnering with several local organizations that share this vision.

NextGen

NextGen is our youth and young adult pillar that works to awaken a life of potential, growth, and opportunity through accessible and supportive education. **We were the first nonprofit in KY to receive the Positivity Project curriculum** which equips Pre-K-12 age groups with digital resources, training, and strategy to teach positive psychology's 24 character strengths and empower students to build positive relationships.
